

Maths GCSE

Course overview

GCSE maths provides you with the opportunity to improve your maths skills and gain a nationally recognised qualification in maths. A GCSE maths qualification can help you progress in education, training and employment and make a positive contribution to your community.

You will work towards extending and developing your mathematical skills whilst working towards your own goals and a GCSE maths qualification.

What will I study?

You will study:

- Fractions, decimals and percentages
- Measures and accuracy
- Algebra
- Solving equations and inequalities
- Ratio, proportion and rates of change
- Geometry
- Probability
- Statistics

Assessment method

Various assessment methods, including on-line and paper-based assessments, individual, group work and communication activities, and given feedback on your progress. Throughout the course you will also receive feedback from your tutor and learn the skills to self-reflect and evaluate your progress.

Entry requirements

You will need to complete a maths access course or Get Ready for GCSE Maths prior to enrolling on this course to ensure this course is at a suitable level for your needs.

What should I bring with me?

You will need to take notes so bring along your preferred tools such as pen/paper or electronic device. An A4 ringbinder folder and a calculator will also be essential.
