Cheeky, naughty or worse? When does the behaviour of a child become a more serious concern? Some roles include having to deal with challenging behaviour in childcare and school settings. This behaviour can be caused by both internal and external factors. In this short course we look at strategies for dealing with challenging behaviour in the moment as well as strategies for managing challenging behaviour longer term.

What will I study?

You will:

- Discuss factors that may contribute to challenging behaviour
- Explore strategies to manage different types behaviour
- Identify ways to remain calm in different situations
- Discuss the different types of behaviour displayed in classrooms
